TIP from PHIL

A tip from Phil: A carbide tipped 3/8" rabbeting bit can be modified to cut a 1/4" deep rabbet. First remove the 1/2" outside diameter (O.D.) 3/16" inside diameter ball bearing guide and dust plate. Then get a 3/16" to 1/4" fiber adaptor W.K.W. #75202 or similar part and cut about a 3/16" length. Install this on the bearing post, then install a 3/4" O.D. 1/4" I.D. bearing W.K.W. #75006.

It is best to use a slightly longer allen tap to accomodate the thicker bearing. Note: No one that I know makes a 3/4" O.D. x 3/16" I.D bearing; hence the fiber adaptor.
