

#### **JULY** DEMONSTRATION "ALLAN BATTY"



Allan Batty is an internationally famous woodturner and master craftsman from England. He is the premier demonstrator and educator for woodturning worldwide.

Allan Batty began as a carriage builder working on the Orient Express. His father was a woodworker and worked on the Queens carriages. He then became one of the a most respected and admired production turners in England, producing turnings for the most expensive buildings in England.

He has exceptional teaching skills that have been developed over a number of years. He was called on to establish the teaching methods and agendas for Craft Supplies in England. Allan demonstrates production and artistic turning. He is considered one of the three experts in the world on thread chasing and the skew chisel.

Allan has produced two videos called "Masterclass" on thread chasing and the skew chisel with more to follow. His next video is to be on boxes. He is noted for is informative demonstrations with jokes, anecdotes, and quips about his son Stewart who has demoed at our club. Allan's teaching method demonstrates not only what to do but why you do it a particular way. You won't want to miss this great demo at \$10 for one session and \$15 for both. First session 1PM to 4PM and second session 6:30PM to 9:30PM. NOTE: Each session will be entirley different incl tech, tips and items.
