

NOVEMBER DEMONSTRATION - DAVID NITTMANN

BIO by

David Nittmann Woodturner

I was playing with wood in my Grandfather's shop as early as 1 can remember, and my• first paid job was "sweeper" at Peters Wooden Toy Factory. I began studying architecture in 1962 at the University of Colorado, but was drafted into the United States Army. Returning to Fort Collins in 1968 with a wife and two children, I enrolled at Colorado State University and received a B.S. with honors in Wildlife Biology and a M.S. In Watershed Science. However, these degrees didn't keep me out of the woods. I was employed in industrial commercial, and residential construction before starting my own cabinet and furniture shop in 1980. Chair making and repair led me to the lathe; I have been obsessed with this tool ever since. In 1994 I cofounded the Rocky Mountain Woodturners and served as president for the first three years. I am on the faculty of Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts, Gatlinburg, Tennessee.

My current focus is the "basket illusion". Using non-figured woods, I turn, burn, and color to create the visual and tactile illusion of a woven form. A subset of this work is the "bodydrum", a decorative but functional instrument. Internationally recognized artist and woodturner David Ellsworth, curator, asked me to submit a bodydrum to the "Horizons 2000" exhibition, summer 2000. I was one of 27 international artists to be featured in the "8" Biennial Works In Wood" exhibit at the Chesterton Art Gallery, October 2000. I am one of the artists in the American Association of Woodtumers exhibition "Nature Takes a Turn" 2001-2002. Mets Lerwill, exhibit coordinator for the California State Fair, invited me to participate in "The Spirit of Wood", summer 2001. I have won numerous awards for "Best of Show" and four times' critically acclaimed at the annual symposium of American Woodturners, a world recognized event. My work is in several private collections throughout the United States.
