#### Potential Impact of New Tariffs on Woodworkers

As many of you have heard, new tariffs are being implemented on goods from Canada, Mexico, and China. While we won't get into the broader economic or political implications, I do want to highlight how these changes might affect the prices of tools and materials we rely on.

#### **Tools & Equipment**

Some Canadian manufacturers known for high-quality woodworking tools may see price increases, including:

- **IBC** Premium chisels and plane blades
- Rob Cosman Hand Tools Specialty woodworking tools
- Lee Valley & Veritas A massive catalog of hand tools, hardware, and specialty items
- JessEm Tools Router lifts, fences, and precision jigs
  - Check out this article about the owner of JessEm Tools, discussing the direction of his company with the new tariffs (<u>link here</u>)

Additionally, American manufacturers may see cost increases on raw materials, as a result of the tariffs on imported steel & aluminum. Within the woodworking world, these two companies come to mind:

• Incra & Woodpeckers – Precision layout tools, fences, and extrusions made from anodized aluminum

Chinese manufacturers like TTI (who owns Milwaukee, Ryobi, Ridgid, & more), and bigger power tool companies like Grizzly (see the Toolbox Alert Column below) & Rikon may increase prices to offset the tariff duties paid for importing their products into the U.S.

Next is David Shih and his "Little Bench"






Following that, we have some "Compound Cut Scroll/Bandsaw Art" from Dennis Edmonds.

## **Meeting Presentations**

## February 2025 Meeting

On February 18<sup>th</sup>, 2025, the CWG welcomed Carlos Flores, of Una Raiz Woodworks to present on Hand Tools and Culture in Fine Woodworking. Carlos focused on the narrative capacity of wood. He illustrated how hand tools provide him with the time to interact deeply with the wood. He also stressed how the quiet environment allows him to listen to and hear the wood. Lastly, he spoke about how the hand tools we use - properly sharpened - enable woodworkers to grow closer to the story the wood wishes to tell.

Carlos shared numerous works with us, such as his Roman Bench; his projects in the green woodworking style, such as bowls and canes; and his Güembé Chairs. The Güembé Chair seeks to adapt Taino rhythms of the music of Puerto Rico into a fluid design style that plays with calmness and power, lightness and strength. One interesting feather Carlos incorporated into his chair is the bricking technique commonly used when making demilune tables. That is, his seat backs were formed using brick lay which adds strength by taking advantage of the long grain.

In all, with a nod to James Krenov and an eye toward cultural hybridity, Carlos provided our Guild with a fascinating and inspiring glimpse into what studio furniture artists of his generation are creating today.
